

VISIT OF FATHER BERNARD PLANCHE

n Saturday March 5, 2022, Father Bernard Planche, Ecclesiastical Counsellor of the French Embassy to the Holy See, visited the Community of the Generalate. His visit was not that of a tourist but that of a believer, a priest, a servant of Jesus, an Ecclesiastical Counsellor of the French Embassy to the Holy See. He was the Parish Priest of the Cathedral of Le Puy-en-Velay (Haute-Loire), and on September 01, 2020, he joined the Villa Bonaparte, in Rome, to succeed Father Michel Cacaud.

During his interview with the Brothers, Father Bernard Planche explained his mission. He spoke about the function of the Ecclesiastical Counsellor, a relatively rare figure since there are only two in French Diplomacy: one in the Jerusalem Consulate and the other in the Embassy to the Holy See. In Rome, few other embassies to the Holy See have such a full-time counsellor.





The role of the Ecclesiastical Counsellor, Father Bernard explained, is to follow the activities of the Holy See, the addresses, the initiatives and the publications of the Pope, and the news of the Catholic Church in the world and in France, in order to facilitate understanding by the State Services and thus avoid misunderstandings. The Embassy is also involved in the appointment of the Bishops of Strasbourg and Metz.

An aperitif and a fraternal meal followed this very enriching exchange during which the Brothers were made aware of the mission of an Ecclesiastical Counsellor, namely, to act as a "bridge" between the French Republic and the smallest city State in the World, the Holy See.

n Sunday March 13, 2022, the Community of the General House had the joy of welcoming Father Maramreddy Maria Joseph Reddy, a former Student of Bro. John Kallarackal, Superior General. Annual Meeting of the three (3) Central Administrations



or many years now, an annual meeting of the three (3) Central Administrations of the Montfortian Family has been organised in order to share the different events and experiences that rhythm the life of each Congregation. This meeting is also a way of consolidating the fraternal relations, the collaboration and the communion between the different Entities

After the 2020 and 2021 editions held online due to the coronavirus pandemic, we were able to hold this year's meeting in presence, at the General House of the Brothers of St. Gabriel from March 24 to March 25, 2022.

The day of 24th March 2022, animated by the Superior General, gave each Congregation the opportunity to share its key elements of progress achieved, the qualitative and quantitative evolution of its varied ministries, the challenges being faced and the attempts made to respond to them. Some common projects for the Montfortian Family were pointed out: The future of La Maison Longue, the Celebration of the 75th Anniversary of the Canonisation of Father de Montfort on 20th July 2022, the 350th Anniversary of the birth of Louis Marie Grignion on 31st January 2023, and the FIM 2022 for the Francophone Group.

On Friday, March 25, 2022, the Montfortian Family celebrated its Patronal Feast of the Annunciation of the Lord with fervour. The Mass was presided over by Father Luiz Augusto Stefani. Following the dynamics of the Synod on Synodality, the celebrant invited each Superior General to share the fruit of his/her meditation on the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord: God comes to man, the ability to listen to God's call, the generous response of man to God's call, the Incarnation of God in the realities of the world, the example of Mary, etc., formed the framework of the catechesis and the spiritual nourishment from which the participants at the Eucharist benefited.

After the Mass, an aperitif was served, during which the Superior General expressed a special word of thanks to Bro. Georges Le Vern, on behalf of the Congregation and the whole Montfortian Family, who after the 22 Years of services at the Casa Generalizia, will return to France in May 2022. n January 31st Bro. Superior and Director of Montfort College, Chiang Mai together with school Administrators and Parents showed their gratitude to St. Louis Marie de Montfort and to the Thai Province for sending Brothers to work at this Northern Region of Thailand since 1932, that is 90 years ago with the invitation of MEP society. The MEP gave the Brothers a plot of land about 2 Hectares and a loan of 20,000 Baht bearing no interest. At the start there were only 24 boys, now there are 5,484 students in the two campuses. There were two Bishops, priests, men and women Religious and parents, benefactors who came to congratulate, and to give encouragement to the Brothers. There were many successful alumni from the College, including a former Prime minister, Governors, high ranking officers and business men in Thailand from Montfort College.

e wish to present you a brief sketch of our mission in Sri Lanka. After all the preliminary studies and visits, the Provincial in council decided to start the mission in Sri Lanka. The Brothers along with the Provincial landed in the mission land in June 2017. We were looking for the land and finally located the present location to start the mission. It is located where most part of the war took place and entire economy was ruined, most people migrated leaving behind their property and possessions. We can still find the effects of war and the scars thereof. People still share the sad stories of the war. They could not revive their family bond, culture, economy. No development could take place thereafter, as the Government would not allow any sort of developmental activities. This region was kept under suppression for a period of 10 years. People underwent utter miseries in life. The unemployment, led people to the extent of indulging in social evils like theft, robbery, even murders. Later when the change of government took place, it gave a little opening for development, little access for education and there was little hope of survival for the people. The rigid rules and regulations imposed in this region were as little relaxed. People started looking up to educational institutions as their only means of future. But the financial difficulty was yet another hindrance

in the process.

At this juncture, we Brothers decided to start a mission in this region, where people were direly in need of education and above all, the Bishop of the diocese also was keenly interested in starting a school by the Brothers in this region mainly for the war-affected children of the Islands and an area which was most affected by 30 years of civil war.



The Brothers started the preliminary works. As expected there were a lot of difficulties in the beginning itself and it took a lot of time to clear everything and the issue with land was yet another factor which caused a lot of delay. Finally, it took 2 years to clear off everything. In the meantime, pandemic played its part to delay the project further. With all these difficulties we carried out the project with utmost commitment and it went steadily forward and with the support of the Administration, the Bishop and the Religious.

All infrastructures were set to start the school. It was blessed on 19th January 2022 by the local Bishop. The response from the public is very encouraging. People, religious and priests are very cordial and positive about our mission. They are edified by the way we move and organize things. We have even invitations from other Dioceses too. We have already set up a campus



that which gives a pleasant learning environment. Lot of tress have been planted and they are coming up to create a green campus. The learning system is on digital basis. This is a mission school and serviceoriented and not for profit which is really a humane and, down to earth. The school is at its infant stage and therefore lot of hard work, continuous monitoring of things is a must. Cluny sisters collaborating with





us, are doing a wonderful service, fully involving and fully at it. Lot of work and services are done by them for the school and which they do cheerfully with a missionary spirit. The school has a lot of hope for the future. As we foresee, it should become self-sufficient in three years time. We don't expect a big flow of students at once, due to the massive migration during the war due to which the population is very scarce particularly in Islands. Currently the country is undergoing a lot of crises, already food emergency is declared a few months back. The prices of the essentials shoot up every day. The political situation has been very precarious and not in favour of people. We need to challenge many things, our simple life





itself has become a challenge to say it in short. Things are tough still we keep going entrusting ourselves to the Providence. Working amidst all these difficulties and challenges, our lives become more colourful and meaningful and the mission becomes enriched.

Against all these odds, we have started the school smoothly. Quite a number of Seminars and Inservice training programmes both online and offline were conducted to prepare the Teachers to meet the class room challenges and demands. The Bishop visits us very often extending his support and encouragement for us. Children come to school with lot of interest and enthusiasm. Parents too show lots of interest in educating the children. The Children look to be very bright and quick to pick up any learning. Sri Lanka is not very far from our mother land (India). Frequent visits of Brothers will certainly enrich our mission. Requesting your prayers for the mission in Sri Lanka.



However, the meeting was overshadowed by the sad news of the demise, at the De La Salle Residence, of bishop Gérard Deschamps, Emeritus of Bereina (Papua New Guinea). Thanks to all for the visit.

A few days earlier, on February 22, Bishop Gilles Côté and Fr. Sigouin, two Montfortian Missionaries had come for a meeting and a meal with us. We could hear quite a lot of stories by Missionaries from Papua and elsewhere. In the afternoon, both went to visit Bishop Deschamps and Fr. Bergeron, at the Residence De La Salle.

In the restructuring plan of the Province of Canada, the Brothers are regrouped in a few local communities. The Properties of Trois-Rivières, Saint-Bruno, Batiscan camp, and Lac Rose, have already been sold to other owners. Then, next July, it will be the turn of DE NORMANVILLE Residence in Montreal. There will be 4 Community Houses remaining in the Province: Saint-Lazare in Cap-de-la Madeleine; Garnier, Saint-Nicolas and the Provincial House in Montreal. Religious Members are aging and the concerns for the household maintenance must be less.

We had our Spring Recollection, on March 23, 2022. The theme completed the one of the first meeting held

A Requiem Mass for the Deceased Brothers of the Province

When the hour of death strikes and the moment of ultimate option has arrived, confirmed by the ever-renewed acceptance of the Lord's will, helped by Mary your Mother, and assisted by your Brothers, you will say: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit". You will pass from death to life, vanguard of your Brothers and of the men you have led to God." (RL. 83).

In addition to this Article of the Rule of Life, other provisions in the Constitutions and General Statutes request each Community to have a Mass celebrated when a Brother dies. For having a common way of action in the Province, the Provincial Superior in Council has decided to pay homage to the deceased Brothers of the Province once a year, during a common Requiem Mass. This provision does not overcome the suffrages for the deceased Brothers requested from each Community. It is just a matter of celebrating a Mass in a parish for the Brothers who have passed away, in a common spirit, united with the biological families of the deceased Brothers.

This year, the Community of Fatick hosted the event in the Parish of St. Joan of Arc. Initially scheduled on January 8, 2022, this day of remembrance had to be postponed because of the funeral of Mrs. Cécile, the elder sister of Bro. Jean-Paul MBENGUE. This commemorative ceremony for our deceased Brothers was rescheduled on Saturday, February 19, at 10 a.m.

The day was organized according to the following program:

9:30 a.m.: Rosary

10 a.m.: Mass

11:30 a.m.: Release of Bro. Henry Biram NDONG's book

1 p.m.: Lunch – Relaxation

3:30 p.m.: Final prayer – Departure of the delegations

In addition to the Brothers of St. Gabriel of the Province, the delegations of the Institutions, we must place on record the presence of the biological families of our deceased Brothers. It was a moment of recollection and communion to recall the memory of our Brothers. An appointment was made in another Community, next year.



FORMATION SESSION

Peul, the Brothers involved in the Province of Senegal, met for a formation session. The Province took advantage of the break of the second quarter to organize a formation session on the theme, "The Essential Conditions for the Involvement and Performance of Staff in Organizations." It was the first Empowerment Session for the Brothers as part of a training module in the management of human resources offered by the Centre for Research and Studies for Development in Africa (CREDA). This first seminar was facilitated by Mr. Alioune Badara LY, a consultant and formator in Social Sciences and Chairman of CREDA.

The Session began with the presentation of the participants who expressed their expectations regarding the theme. The participants had to introduce themselves and present their expectations in a simple way. Then, the Facilitator explained the meaning of management, involvement, and performance. Management is a set of actions made by a person or a group of people within the framework of a structure

to get results. For an easy and quick understanding of management, just remember the acronym DOLE: D: Design – O: Organize – L: Lead – E: Evaluate.

Involvement means working as a team. It must lead to an active participation.

Performance means doing better in less time.

Then, the participants were invited to reflect, in groups, on the possible interactions within the internal and external environment of the organization, to fill in an organizational diagnosis and elaborate a table with the possible solutions. After sharing the findings and some information, in general Assembly, the formation session ended at 1 p.m. The next training Session is to take place on April 22, at Malika.

2nd Meeting of Associates groups of Madrid and Barcelona

he second face-to-face meeting of Shared Mission Associates of the Province of Spain was held in Madrid and Barcelona on 12 and 19 February, respectively.

The theme dealt with was the special importance that Saint Louis Marie de Montfort attached to Baptism and the renewal of baptismal promises in his parish missions at the beginning of the 18th century.

In order to understand his missionary action and the importance he attached to this practice, we refer to the pastoral renewal movement of the 17th century. Father de Montfort was the bearer of the post-Council of Trent currents, but even if Saint Louis Marie was the heir of his illustrious predecessors in the mission, it seems that none of them received as vividly as he did the slogan of the necessary return to the meaning and demands of baptism in order to "renew the spirit of Christianity" among the faithful and in the

Church. This is shown by the solemnity with which he surrounded this act and, in particular, the signing of the "covenant contract" in his parish missions. For Montfort, baptism will not only be an important practice of the mission, but will become the ultimate goal of the whole mission. To this it must be added the innovation brought by our founder concerning the role of the Virgin Mary, the maternal bond of the Mother of Jesus with every baptized person to help him to be faithful to the commitments made to the Lord, her Son.

Father de Montfort was faithful to the Church and to the pastoral purpose promoted by the Tridentine Reform, faithful to the mandate received from Clement XI - who recommended him to teach Christian doctrine well in order to awaken the spirit of Christianity, through the renewal of the promises of baptism - but with his personal note, a more and a better inspired by his apostolic charism: that of illuminating fully



the role of Mary in the life of the baptised for a total fidelity to Jesus Christ.

At both the Madrid and Barcelona meetings, we reflected in small groups on the content of the Covenant contract and its expression; and on Mary's bond with every baptised person, with the reading of several numbers of The Treatise on True Devotion to Mary. We then shared, in a large group, all the ideas that had emerged. The topic was very much appreciated because it allowed us to get to know and get closer to St. Louis. And of course, we also

enjoyed a time of relaxed chatting over a delicious breakfast offered by the hosts of the school in Madrid and in the Provincial Curia in Barcelona, where the two meetings were held.






DEATH OF Fr. (DON) CARLO BESSONNET (1922-2022) CHAPLAIN OF THE GENERAL HOUSE FROM 2000 TO 2010


on Carlo Bessonnet (1922-2022) priest from the diocese of Poitiers (France) was parish priest of the cathedral of La Storta (Rome) from 1956 to 1993. He was the Vicar General of the diocese of Porto-Santa Rufina, for many years. He had acquired the Italian Nationality.

In 2000, at the age of 78, during his retirement, he became Chaplain of the General House of the Brothers of St. Gabriel for 10 years. Many Brothers, as Members of the Community of the Generalate, have known him. Student Brothers, Capitulants, Brothers participating in Formation Sessions, in pilgrimages, etc., came to know him as well.

In 2010, when he was 88 years old, Don Carlo was welcomed by the Sisters Ancelle della Visitazione, in their Rest Home "Oasi Tabor" in Santa Marinella (Lazio): the Sisters watched over him admirably. He died on Easter Monday, April 18, 2022, at the dawn of his 100th Birthday.

Here is the testimony sent by Brother René Delorme, Superior General from 2000 to 2012, after the announcement of Don Carlo's death: "I keep the memory of Don Carlo as a man with a great heart, benevolent, generous, always ready to help. I appreciated the prayerful way in which he celebrated the Eucharist, his deep reflections on the Word of God, and his authentic testimony of life. He leaves us the memory of a holy man of God! Our Brother Camille Lucas had been well inspired when, in 2000, looking for a Chaplain for the Casa, he had contacted him. "Yesterday, at 9:00 a.m. (Quebec time), as we began our Provincial Council meeting, we joined all those who, at the same time (3:00 p.m., Roman time), paid him a last homage in the Cathedral of La Storta. »

Brother Camille Lucas gives this other testimony: "Don Carlo, although at the end of his life, did not take his mission as chaplain of the General House as a useful pastime for a retiree. On the contrary, he had a high idea of his mission and served it according to the pastoral rules which he knew to perfection...and this was the PASTORAL SERVICE of a General House. It really impressed me."

The Community of the Generalate benefited liturgically from Don Carlo's interest and support. We owe him:

- The large bronze Reliquary dedicated to St. Louis-Marie and Blessed Marie-Louise, wanted and offered by him in 2000-2001. It is a valuable legacy,
- The purchase of several chasubles of different colors, for the celebration of the Eucharist,
- The purchase, in 2008, of new liturgical lectionaries, in Italian, for our Chapel, with the new translation requested by the Italian Bishops' Conference.



MARTYRS OF THE RELIGIOUS PERSECUTION DURING THE CIVIL WAR OF SPAIN IN 1936





Cayo BAÑUELOS PALENCIA Brother Salvador, 27 years old Born in Urbel del Castillo (Burgos)

Already in the Juniorate and in the Novitiate he was considered one of the best. He was very pious and an admirer of the Holy Virgin.

Intelligent and of strict judgment, according to his Master of Novices, Brother Cyprius. His saintliness and modesty was reflected in his countenance.

He was a teacher at the Schools in Arenys de Mar, Bañolas, Valls and at the Formation House of San Vicente de Montalt (Can Valls).

He had an admirable sense of family and a complete dedication to teaching. Given his excellent qualities as a religious person he was named collaborator of the Master of Novices, Brother Estanislao. He became a great support to the Master of Novices, as the latter declared on numerous occasions: "He adds to his beautiful qualities of spirit and heart, a great piety, and an admirable sense of family and a complete dedication to his position as teacher and collaborator.

He never raised his voice to his novices and he knew how to command respect from the group of teachers who appreciated and respected him greatly, despite the fact that he was somewhat innocent in nature.

Brother Salvador demonstrated a great serenity and courage when he was surprised in the chapel with his novices by the militia assaulting the convent.

Cesäreo VILLANUEVA IRIARTE Brother Tarsicio, 29 years old Born in Jaurrieta (Navarra)

Early on he was orphaned. Due to his beautiful voice he enrolled in the choir school of the Real Colegiata de Roncesvalles which he attended during seven years that marked him for the rest of his life.

He was fervent as a novice. In his file we read that his strength of judgment was excellent, he had an energetic and nervous character, and his intelligence was outstanding. He had a strong sense of family, was pious and quiet and attentive and persevering in his work.

He was a teacher at the schools in Valls, San Adrian de Besés and in San Vicente de Montalt (Can Valls).

A brother filled with good will. He completed his musical education in France becoming a good organist. He was melodious and a musical virtuoso.

At the Formation House of Can Valls he was a teacher of the Juniorate, Organist, music teacher of the Novices and the Scholasticate until November of 1936.

Beloved by his students of the Juniorate, who responded strongly when he was detained by the militia on the 7th of November of 1936, some exclaiming out loud and with great feeling when they were taking him prisoner to the buses that waited on the road to transport them to the jail in Barcelona.
