19TH COUNCIL OF THE INSTITUTE MONTFORT NILAYA, BENGALURU CLOSING MESSAGE – 24.02.2023

Introduction:

Good afternoon to you all. As we come to the end of the 2 weeks we have lived together as brothers, as leaders of the different entities of our Congregation, participating in the 19th Council of the Institute, I feel confident to call it an “unqualified success”, on more counts than one. As our Constitutions rightly put it, “The Council of the Institute has for mission to provide, through concerted action, the common good and unity of the Institute”. As we look back at the days we have lived together as members of the 19th Council of the Institute, it was evident that there was a sense of unity and charity among the 30 participants, despite the fact that we were coming from the different continents, born and brought up in different cultures, belonging to varied age groups and embracing different philosophies of life, and that the Provincial of Brazzaville was constrained to join us online. I am sure that all the participants will be able to affirm, in one voice, that the 2 weeks we have spent together as leaders of the Congregation, was truly an occasion to strengthen our bond as members of one large family, living out our fraternity and common brotherhood, and making a realistic appraisal of our life and mission. I have no hesitation in saying that everyone who witnessed our life here during these days would spontaneously acclaim, “See how they love one another”! It was indeed very encouraging to see the Brothers interacting with one another in a spirit of mutual respect, and listening to one another non-judgmentally, during the participation in the discussions and reflections, both in the groups and in the General Assembly.

Words of Appreciation:

If we can call the 19th Council of the Institute an “unqualified success”, it is thanks to the hard work and collaborative efforts of different individuals and groups. On behalf of the whole Congregation, I wish to place on record my sincere appreciation to all those who have contributed in one way or another

towards the planning, preparation and the successful completion of these sessions.

In the first place, I raise my heart in thanksgiving to God for accompanying us throughout the whole process and making it possible for us all, except the Provincial Superior of Brazzaville, to be present at the venue, without any hassles. Secondly, I wish to express my sincere thanks to each member of the Central Administration for his significant contribution towards the success of this Council of the Institute. In the same breath, I must express my sincere thanks to the National Council of India, which wholeheartedly came forward to host this Council of the Institute. Similarly, our thanks go to the Provincial Administration of Bengaluru Province and the Provincial House Community, for extending full and generous co-operation right from the beginning. Everyone was impressed by the warm welcome, rich hospitality, tasteful decorations and the attractive ambience, not to speak about the tasty food, with sufficient choices. Congratulations to the Catering Services! Though a formal vote of thanks will be proposed mentioning individual names, during the Closing Ceremony, I wish to make a special mention of Bro. Irudayam, the National Chairman, Bro. George Padikara, the Provincial Superior of Bengaluru, Bro. John Britto, the National Secretary, who were involved in the planning and preparation for months together. Bros. Vijay, Justin, Antony, K. K. Thomas and Jenny, Sr. Daisy, Mr. Joseph, and Mrs. Regina, the Administrative Staff of the Provincial House, were like guardian angels. Whenever we needed them, they were there in all simplicity and true fraternal love and care.

Similarly, we had our 2 interpreters, Brothers Remy Ndong and Michel Mendy, who carried out their tasks with an appreciable degree of competence and commitment. Even when some of the participants had the temptation to doze off, they were there fully alert, being effective channels of communication. Seeing all the presentations in 2 languages, you can imagine

what lot of documents had to be translated into English or French. Most of the translations were done by Brothers George Le Vern and Marcel Chapeleau. I wish to say a big thanks to each one of them for their valuable services. We owe our special appreciation to Bro. Jean-Marie Thior, the Secretary General, who coordinated the whole process. I also wish to take this opportunity, on behalf of all the participants to thank our Secretaries, Brothers John Britto and Jean-Marie Ndour, who were carrying out their works with quiet efficiency, putting into practice the difficult art of listening, without speaking, and serving with a smile always. And so were our technical experts, Bros. Dionigi Taffarello and Michael Mathew, and Mr. John, who were always alert, keeping their eyes and ears always open, and acting promptly.

It was a real blessing that the presence of Bro. Ignatius (INT) and priests from the neighboring Religious Congregations to celebrate the Eucharist during all the days of the 19th Council of the Institute. I must acknowledge that the opportunities we had to visit our Brothers in the different communities and the members of the Montfortian Family did help us strengthen the bond of relationship among the Brothers and with the Montfortian Family.

Though Fr. David Glenday, the Facilitator for our 33rd General Chapter could not be present with us during the sessions here in Bengaluru, we are glad that he could participate through Zoom, when we had the crucial discussion on the strategies to be followed in arriving at the Instrumentum Laboris and how it could be used to elicit responses from the individual Brothers, the Communities, our Associates and our stakeholders in our ministries. You will agree with me that our Chapter Preparatory Committee Members have been on their toes ever since their arrival, and have put together an excellent schema. On behalf of the Congregation, I wish to say in advance a big thanks to Bros. Jaico, Etienne, Irudayam, Jimmy and René, for their valuable share of contributions towards the smooth and efficient conduct of the next General Chapter. My sincere thanks and congratulations also go to all the Moderators of the 19th Council of the Institute, first of all to the 4 Assistants General, Bros. Dionigi, Jean-Paul, Pratap and James, and more especially to Brs. André, Etienne, Irudayam and Varghese Mandapathil, the elected ones. It will be no exaggeration if I say that they all discharged their responsibilities with a touch of professionalism! In the same breath, I wish to appreciate the good work done by the 4 Moderators and the Secretaries of the Groups, which facilitated the discussions in the

groups and in the General Assemblies.

You will agree with me that the volume of work carried out by the International Commission and the 2 Sub-Commissions for the Revision of the Rule of Life and Constitutions, has been truly commendable, that too with Covid-19 playing spoil sport, stealing away 2 precious years. On behalf of all the participants of the 19th Council of the Institute I offer my sincere congratulations to the Convenor of the International Commission and the other members.

Finally, I wish to place on record my appreciation to all the leaders of the entities for the realistic presentations of your entities, and for your active and dignified participation in the discussions in the Groups and in the General Assembly, always keeping “the common good and unity of the Institute” (C 185). I was happy to see the spirit of camaraderie and brotherhood prevailing throughout the sessions, treating everyone with love and respect, despite the difference of language and the attendant problems!

Time of Grace:

It is needless for me to reiterate that the time we spent together in Bengaluru, was truly a time of grace. The presence of the Archbishop Peter Machado of Bengaluru, at the opening ceremony of the 19th Council of the Institute on 12th evening, with the representative presence of men and women religious, gave an ecclesial colour to our sessions here. As he gently reminded us during his homily, we are all expected to be consecrated persons who always do a little more especially to the poor, the disadvantaged and the vulnerable.

The presence of Rt. Rev, Arul Selvam Rayappan, Bishop of Salem, speaking on “Synodality in the Church and Religious Community” was indeed very enlightening and energizing. The simple ways he explained the three elements of Communion, Participation and Mission, in the context of our life as consecrated persons, and our life in the Religious Communities, carrying out our mission according to the charism of our Congregation, were truly inspiring. His clarion call to imitate Mother Mary in speaking of the world to Jesus, and speaking of Jesus to the world, still keeps ringing in our ears.

In dealing with the topic “Psycho-spiritual aspects of Religious Life”, Rev. Fr. M. C. Abraham, posed several thought-provoking questions, like whether our spiritual software is configured to unleash the

God-given potential, and whether our perception, interpretation of the different events in our lives can result in a change in our attitudes, feelings and behaviour resulting in creation of a better world order.

Rt. Rev. Bishop Raja Rao of Vijayawada diocese gave a graphic description of the grim realities that face us in India in particular on the socio-economic and political scenario, and how these realities can be a challenge to us to live our lives as consecrated persons and to carry out our varied ministries in the Church. At the same time, he also gently reminded us that living our Montfortian Prophetic dimension following the salient elements of the Montfortian Spirituality can be an antidote against these challenges.

The Administrative software of the Congregation that was presented to us during the session is typical example of how determination and diligence of Bro. Michael Mathew, the General Bursar, and Mrs. Ramya Soundrarajan, the CEO of iRoots Software company, have made the apparently impossible, possible. I have no doubt that this new feature of a common Administrative Software will bring in greater order in our system, besides saving a lot on our time and energy on doing routine administrative tasks.

Planning for the Future:

As we listened to the reports of the different entities, we realized that we had several reasons to thank God for, as a Congregation. But at the same time, we became acutely aware “that we Brothers are influenced by the dominant counter values of our culture which ensnare us in the dynamics of consumerism, superficiality, individualism and greed” (31 GC 7), and that the lack of religious spirit, lack of fraternal life in the communities, groupism based on different affiliations, craving for power, positions and possessions, etc., continue to be a constant threat of the witness dimension of our consecrated life as individuals and as communities.

During the evaluation of our life and mission as consecrated persons, especially in the backdrop of the Message and Orientations of the 32nd General Chapter and the proposals of the 18th Council of the Institute, we became more and more convinced that “we the Montfort Brothers of St. Gabriel, must face a serious process of spiritual renewal that will help us, as persons and as communities, to reduce the gap between our documents and our life, in order to live a spirituality that is visible, credible and prophetic” (31 GC 11).

As I mentioned during the Inaugural Message the two principal objectives of our 19th Council of the Institute are to make an assessment of the journey we have undertaken since our 32nd General Chapter and to plan for the coming 33rd General Chapter. Let us pray and hope that the entry door we have identified for our next General Chapter, “Montfortian Prophetic Presence in the 21st century” will propel us to personal conversion, make our communities true witnesses of the evangelical values, help us put into practice the elements of good governance with greater transparency and accountability at all levels, make our mission truly Montfortian in character, and help us address the different challenges we face today in our Congregation, by being prophetic leaders of the 21st century, causing changes within and around.

During our discussions and reflections, we were repeatedly reminded, “The Provincial Superior bears the main responsibility for the Province, in the service of the apostolic religious life of the Brothers” (C 135). Therefore, let us go back to our entities with renewed enthusiasm and determination to play our role as animators and administrators more effectively. There is no doubt that there will always be lots of challenges, but as Martin Luther King beautifully put it, “If you can’t fly, then run, if you can’t run, then walk, if you can’t walk then crawl; but whatever you do, you have to keep moving forward”.

Conclusion:

Before I conclude, let me once again thank each one of you for your contribution towards the success of the 19th Council of the Institute. The Convenor and the members of the Chapter Preparatory Committee have given us sufficient food for our reflections. The Committee has reminded us that we are not expected to be just prophets, but prophetic leaders, who cause changes all around through their prophetic action. As our Rule of Life powerfully reminds us “You become a special presence of Christ: your life shows forth the absolute priority of your choice of God, even at the heart of your professional undertakings. What you believe, what you live, you cannot but proclaim it: you preach the good news” (RL 59).

The message you carry to the Brothers, Associates and Collaborators from this Council of the Institute should inspire everyone concerned to live a life of greater authenticity, committing themselves to the cause of participating in the Church’s mission of evangelization, witnessing and human promotion. As Bro. Jaico reminded us the other day, quoting from

Zig Zigler, “What you get by achieving your goals is not as important as what you become by achieving your goals”. It will not be out of place for me to repeat what I quoted at the end of the ADC Report and what the Chapter Preparatory Committee reminded us, in the context of the theme of the upcoming 33rd General Chapter: “I am counting on you “to wake up the world”, since the distinctive sign of consecrated life is prophecy. As I told the Superiors General: ‘Radical evangelical living is not only for religious: it is demanded of everyone. But religious follow the Lord in a special way, in a prophetic way’. This is the priority that is needed right now: ‘to be prophets who witness to how Jesus lived on this earth... a religious must never abandon prophecy” (Apostolic Letter of Pope Francis to all Consecrated Persons, II, 2).

In keeping with the theme of the Closing Prayer Service this afternoon, “You are sent forth as leaders of Montfortian Mission”. My sincere thanks in advance to Bros. Irudayam and Herman, for preparing the Prayer Session, with a dance by the students of Wisdom Montfort. As you return to your entities, please convey our greetings to all the Brothers in your entities.

Wish you all a meaningful preparation for the 33rd General Chapter. Thank you and God bless.

60TH DIAMOND JUBILEE

On Friday, November 25, 2022. Bro. Sakda Sakonthawat, the Director of ACT and the School Administrators organized the ACT 60th Diamond Jubilee of the school. This institution was founded in 1961. Mr. Tanjai Suwannathat, alumnus of AC Bangkok offered a piece of land, 9 Hectares to Bro. John Mary, the then Provincial to start another school on the other side of the Chao Phraya River. The Brother built a wooden one-storey building comprising of 15 classrooms.

On May 17th, 1961 ACT started with 123 students and 5 teachers. Now there are over 5000 students and 28

buildings for classes, modern equipment for students to acquire more advanced knowledge and books in the library. On the 60th Diamond Jubilee celebration, Rev. Archbishop of Tharae-Nongsaeng, Anthony Weradet Chaiseri, the main celebrant with a few priests offered the thanksgiving Mass, together with Brothers, Alumni, Parents, teachers, and students attended the celebration. After the celebration, the Archbishop blessed the 3-storey Learning Space to provide new ways for students to acquire and search for new advanced knowledge in their own interest happily. The day ended with a Chinese lunch.

VISITING THE SOCIAL CENTER AT OUR LADY OF MERCY CHURCH

On Saturday, December 17, faculty members, personnel and students of Assumption University visited the St. Martin Social Center at Our Lady of Mercy Church, Ban Mai, Pak kret, Nonthaburi. This social centre is under the care of P.I.M.E. (Pontifical Institute for Foreign Missions Priests). We brought Christmas and New Year gifts for over one hundred children who are housed there. Twenty volunteers take care of them.

PERSONAL ACCOUNT OF F. JEAN FRIANT ON OCCASION OF THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE INSTITUTE OF APPLIED MATHEMATICS, (IMA)

What happened in Angers on Saturday 14th January 2023?

The Catholic University of the West in Angers (UCO) wanted to mark the 50th anniversary of the Institute of Applied Mathematics (IMA). The Rector of the University Mr. Laurent Péridy, himself former Director of the Institute, participated in the celebration.

I was the first. At the closing gala, in a restaurant at Terra Botanica, there were more than 250 of us, mostly former students and former and current teachers. But one notable absence was that of Brother Michel Morfin, confined to his room due to health problems. Brother Michel was a member of the team that launched the IMA, and the class of 2006 will even take the name "Michel Morfin".

How did you come to open, create/found such an institute?

It was in February 1965 that I became an assistant in mathematics at the Faculty of Sciences of the UCO. There were about ten of us Brothers teaching in this Catholic university: in literature, languages, law and maths. My research director, Mr. Benzécry, embarked me on a new field, namely the mathematical structures of languages which involved mathematical linguistics. The IMA was in its infancy without me suspecting it. On 24 June 1966, I defended my doctoral thesis at the University of Paris VI, "Pierre et Marie Curie". I now had to undertake the State Doctorate.

1968 A very exciting, year in Canada!

I was to benefit from a very favourable circumstance. A Canadian laboratory of the Faculty of Arts of the University of Montreal, working on English-French translation with the help of computers, hired me as a mathematician. I was accommodated at the provincial house of the province of Montreal, which was then located on Canterbury Avenue, near the University of Montreal. I lived there in the community with a Brother of Saint Gabriel who worked in the same research centre as a linguist. It was Bro. Adélarde Faubert, whom I would meet again in Rome as secretary and translator at the Generalate. Canada was a dream place for me, because if during the week I worked hard, the weekends were regularly spent in the middle of nature, at Camp Marcel. It was a fantastic year for me in many ways!

The return to Angers

Having discovered many theorems, I returned to Angers at the beginning of 1969. I found a very different university from the one I had left in February, marked by the events of May 68. And very quickly I found myself elected, at the age of 30, to be in charge of the Sciences. From then on, I had to deal with administrative activities for which I had not been prepared, and this delayed the writing of my doctoral thesis. I will defend it in June 1971, still at Paris-VI.

A crisis at the Catholic University

First of all, there was the problem of awarding diplomas. It was also the time when the city of Angers wanted to have its own state university. The "Catho" was seen as an obstacle to this creation. It was in this context of survival that the Catholic university set up, at the beginning of the 1970 academic year, 4 university institutes, including the Institute of Applied Mathematics (I.M.A). Roger Texier, who hold a Doctorate in Philosophy, will be in charge of the Teacher Training Institute. In 1977, Brother Michel Taillé became a Pillard of the Institute of Languages after serving 12 years in Rome as Vicar General of Brother Romain Landry. I was joined

by three young laymen plus Brother Michel Morfin who had started teaching mathematics at the university in 1966

What happened to you in 1977?

At Easter 1977, I was requested by Brother Jean Bulteau, Superior General, to become Provincial of the Province of Nantes, one of the three French Provinces at that time. I had no intention of leaving the IMA prematurely. It cost me a lot. I gave my answer only after three days spent in an abbey for discernment. Seen now, I feel that this departure was beneficial both for me and for the IMA. For me, I was not abandoning the IMA completely. Indeed, having been appointed for a limited term, I was planning to return to the "Catho" after six years. So I continued to give in-service training sessions in companies on behalf of the IMA. I continued these courses until 1988 when I was appointed Superior General. I then stopped my work for the IMA for good. And here I am at the head of another Institute, which has little to do with a maths Institute!

Why an Institute of Applied Mathematics?

Until that time, mathematics was essentially applied to the physical sciences. With the appearance of the first computers and new branches of mathematics, we were convinced that there would be more and more opportunities for mathematical analysts, equipped with the computer tool, in many sectors of the social sciences and humanities: banks, large companies, and elsewhere. To date, the institute has trained 1,248 graduates who, in 5 years, have prepared their MIASHS (Mathematics and Computer Science Applied to the Humanities and Social Sciences) Masters. 90% find a job in less than two months.

FORMATION SESSION ON ADMINISTRATION AND PERSONEL MANAGEMENT

Institution René Merceron, Mbour 7 January 2023



After a long period of suspension, the empowerment courses on Administration and Personnel management destined for the Brothers resumed. Initiated last year by the province, these formation courses provided by CREDA (Centre for Research and Studies for Development in Africa) are to be continued this year.

The latest seminar was held in Mbour on 7 January, and was based on three activities:

- 1- Explanation of the ACTES method of file management,
- 2- Strategies for involving stakeholders (in the development of the structure),
- 3- Sharing workshop on involvement strategies.

1- This first activity focused on organization and files

management. This method consists of arranging files in a methodical way, according to the A.C.T.E.S. approach.

The letter **A** represents the drawer containing current files, i.e., the files to be dealt with today, which are arranged from the most urgent to the least urgent. This drawer will be empty at the end of the day because all the files are processed or stored in a Follow-up drawer.

This drawer consists of Mail files (Arrival / Departure) for the **C**. The email will be processed and the conclusions stored in the Transmit drawer.

The letter **T** represents the file drawer to be forwarded (services/persons). The processed letters are forwarded to the right person.

The **E** stands for the drawer for files to be eliminated. Make sure that files that are no longer needed are removed. This is the drawer for files to be followed up for the **S**. At the end of the day, this drawer will receive the files that have not yet been processed, from the most urgent to the least urgent.

2- The second session of formation focused on sectors of management activity. An interactive workshop on involvement strategies was held, and heads of mission were chosen.

Meeting of the Associates of the Province of Spain

On Saturday 28 January, the associates of the Province of Spain met in Barcelona and Madrid to celebrate the meeting they had planned on the theme of Mary.

At 10:30 a.m., in the premises of the Provincial House of Barcelona, the group of the Gabrielite Shared Mission of Catalonia met to focus on the development of the personality of St. Louis Marie de Montfort, from the point of view of his Marian devotion, in his childhood and youth until his ordination as a priest, and later, in his time as an apostolic missionary. The exhibition presented the "external practices" that St. Louis proposed to us to please and glorify God and that he put into practice in his missionary activity. External practices which, as he insisted, must always correspond to "internal practices".

After a snack, we watched the episodes of Jesus lost in the Temple and the wedding at Cana. We reflected on the attitude of Mary, who not only accepted to be the mother of Jesus, but who, by her yes, also accepted the divine identity and saving mission of her son.

In the afternoon, at 5 p.m., the group AGMONT met, also in the Provincial House, to work on the same theme. They first analysed the relationship between Mary and Jesus through five episodes of the Gospel, and then established Mary's relationship with us. Finally, they also looked at the theme: Who was Mary for Father de Montfort? After the Eucharist, they had a relaxed dinner together.

For their part, the group of Montfort Family associates from Madrid and La Aguilera met with the group of MCG associates from Madrid at the school in Madrid at 10:5 a.m. They were joined by several collaborators from the school and by two other associates online from Jaén. After the opening prayer, Brother Ángel Llana presented the figure of Mary as it is presented by the Church:

- Mary Mother of God... co-creator (engenders God in History)
- Virgin Mary... free (God is the only reason for her human existence)
- Mary Immaculate... co-redemptrix (Mary is the example of what we can assume with God's grace)
- Mary Assumed... assumes her identity (reevaluation of the unity between body and spirit)

After the presentation, an episode of the series *The Chosen* was shown in which Mary talks with the disciples while Jesus heals the sick Samaritans. During the break, participants chatted and enjoyed good coffee and sweets. Then groups were formed to discuss a series of questions about our relationship with Mary. This first part of the meeting ended with a prayer to Our Lady. After lunch, the group visited the parish of Santa Maria del Silencio, which has been working, since 2012, with a group of people with sensory disabilities, deaf and dumb. The parish priest explained the history of the parish and the role they currently play in it.

A Saturday entirely dedicated to the memory and honour of Mary, Mother of Jesus and our Mother, as well as to the memory of the personal experience of St. Louis in his devotion to the Virgin Mary, which gave rise to his Marian doctrine that has meant so much to the Church and to us all.

The World Youth Day - 2023



The World Youth Day (WYD) begins from 1st to 6th of August 2023 in Lisbon, Portugal. The theme for this WYD is the Bible verse “Mary arose and went with haste” (Lk 1:39). The Youth (of all faiths) between the ages 15 to 35 are invited to be part of this massive event. Pope Francis himself closely monitors overall preparations. The Preparation Committee had a general audience with Pope in the first week of January 2023. WYD will be a special event in which Youth will be exposed to the teachings of Jesus Christ and be empowered to live in the way of Christ. The Youth will be able to connect to the universal Church and be part of a global movement of faith. WYD will be a time for the youth to come together, share their faith, and ideas, and create a platform for fellowship and understanding.

This event will include various activities such as catechesis, Mass, talks, workshops, and various cultural activities. It will also provide opportunities to meet with Pope Francis and other senior Church leaders. This will be a platform to promote ecumenical dialogue between the youth of different religions. The Youth will be encouraged to come together in a spirit of understanding and respect, to share their views. WYD will inspire the youth to create a better world and build bridges of understanding, and peace in order to become true instruments of the Gospel.

How it all began:

The concept of WYD was influenced by the summer camps of youth in Poland in 1960s. Over time bishops were guided to schedule “Youth days” in their dioceses on the Palm Sunday of every year (currently on the feast of Christ the king). Late Pope Saint John Paul II in the year 1984 invited the youth from around the world to St. Peter's square, Rome for the international Jubilee of the Youth. He was overwhelmed to witness the presence of three lakhs of youth at that event. During this event, Pope John Paul II handed the wooden cross to be carried throughout the world as the symbol of infinite Love for humankind. The following year (1985), Pope invited the youth from around the world to Rome to participate in the “United Nations International year of the youth” and here he officially instituted **The World Youth Day on 20th Dec 1985**. Since then, a total of 15 WYDs described below were celebrated.

Popes and WYDs: Since the time of its inception WYDs are very close to the hearts of Popes. Their very presence at every WYDs is something to be noted. The youth encounter Pope to imprint the message in their hearts.

Saint John Paul II: He, The founder of WYDs is regarded as the Pope of the youth. From being, a chaplain to the university students at *Kraków* inviting them to the weekend programs like Mass, conferences, hiking, and sharing their lives, he never missed a chance to spend time with the youth as a priest. He gained confidence in the youth because he took them seriously. He was an extensive traveller who considered travelling as a pilgrimage. He visited 129 countries more than any other Pope in history. He enjoyed being with the people.



Pope Benedict XVI: He presided over three WYDs and they were very special to him. “The World Youth Days are truly part of the most beautiful memories of my entire pontificate. Cologne, Sidney, and Madrid are three milestones I will never forget. I was simply happy to be able to participate, to be accepted, and to be able to help others,” said Pope Emeritus in the book *The Latest Conversations with Peter Seewald*. The body of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI was being mourned with the same red chasuble he wore during the final Mass of The World Youth Day, Sydney 2008. His body was buried with the same red chasuble. “The fire of God’s love may descend upon your hearts and fill them, in order to unite you ever more closely to the Lord and his Church and to send you out, as a new generation of apostles, to lead the world to Christ” – Pope Benedict XVI at WYD, Sydney.

Pope Francis: Pope Francis’ great affection for the young is clearly visible in his initiative in conducting a synod on Young People, Faith, and Vocational discernment. Subsequently, the first-ever Vatican document on young people – the apostolic exhortation *Christus Vivit*, or “Christ Lives” (CV). Three important themes are 1. Jesus was a young person. 2. We are called to return to the source of youth. 3 Be a saint. Pope Francis says in the opening paragraph that it is meant to remind you of certain convictions born of our faith, and at the same time to encourage you to grow in holiness and in commitment to your personal vocation” (CV 3).



Logo: The logo for this WYD is designed by a young female Portuguese designer of 24 years old namely Beatriz Roque Antunes. Her Logo won the contest among many other logos around the world. The colours (green, red, and yellow) evoke the Portuguese flag. The elements in the logo are: 1. Cross 2. Path 3. Rosary and 4. Mary.

Symbols of WYD: *The pilgrim cross:* a 3.8 meter wooden cross was handed to the youth by Saint John Paul II in the year 1984 to be carried around the world. It has already travelled to almost 90 countries and 5 continents. It has been a symbol of hope and a sign of faith. Since 2003 *The icon of Our Lady Salus Populi Romani* also accompanies the cross. The 1.20-meter tall and 80-centimeter wide Icon was added by Saint John Paul II to signify the presence of Mother Mary among the youth. Prior to an apostolic journey, Pope Francis prays before this original icon which is housed in the Basilica of Santa Maria Major in Rome.

The official theme song: The theme song is about the ‘yes’ of Mary and about her rush to meet her cousin Elizabeth. It is entitled “Há Pressa no Ar”. Written by a priest and musician of Portugal. It was released in Portuguese, Spanish, English, Italian, and French.



Conclusion:

Pope John Paul II, left a legacy for the youth in his institution of The World Youth Day. Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis faithfully continued to carry on this legacy, demonstrating the hope of the pontiff for the youth of the world by inviting them and commissioning them to be faithful living witnesses as Christ's disciples. Pope Francis reinforced that *"the secret to staying young"* is precisely in these two verbs - get up and leave. Addressing young people, he asked that *"do not stop thinking about yourselves, wasting your lives in search of comfort or the latest fashion, but "hit the road, get out of your fears to extend a hand to those who are in need."*

"Today we need young people who are truly transgressors. Nonconformists. May they not be slaves to cell phones, but change the world like Mary, bringing Jesus to others, taking care of others, building fraternal communities with others, realizing dreams of peace, said the Pope.

God created us to be fully alive.

Brother Diego, 32 years old
Born in Redecilla del Campo
(Burgos)

He enrolled having already turned 17, and having little instruction due to which he had to make great efforts to catch up. He felt a great love for his vocation. He worked hard to correct his often overly lively character.

He served his military service in Burgos and in the Hospital of Pamplona. There he met a pious woman who helped him a great deal to dodge the dangers of life in the barracks.

He could not spend much time in the Scholasticate, and soon the Director, Brother Perboyre, required that he begin performing manual tasks. He was always pious, and willing to be useful to his Community. He was particularly gifted in predicting the actions of others.

He was very well informed of all that went on in the large Formation House of Can Valls through his position as doorman and telephone operator. He was also in charge of the community's footwear. In other words he was somewhat the Community's public relations.

He had a very pronounced gabrielite personality in the midst of his multiple occupations. It fell on him to warn to the whole Community, up to three times, of the impending danger that neared with the anarchists of the F.A.I., and in particular on the 7th of November when the convent was brutally assaulted by the control patrols.

A good and quite sociable character. " Serious, pious, dedicated, and of a good spirit".

"Of a somewhat shy character he is fearful of affronting certain difficulties and he complains easily about minor miseries". On the other hand he appears to be very happy and loves his vocation. He has worked within the limitations of the resources available to him and he is pious.

A Brother of good character and always willing to obey. He would often go to the chapel during times of recess. This young Brother, 20 years old, offered his sacrifice to the Lord by working with great dedication in humble jobs within the clothing area, the laundry and the vegetable garden, where his cultivation of carnations for foreign sale really stood out.

His great dedication was to doing the small things well and then to go unnoticed as though he had done nothing special. Very attentive and energetic he was the model of order in all his jobs. Therefore it is of no surprise that he was greatly loved within the community.

The Superiors left behind the best testimony of him by presenting him as a model of a religious person, gentle and pious. He was one of the pillars of that monastic religious life, full of virtues and merits.
